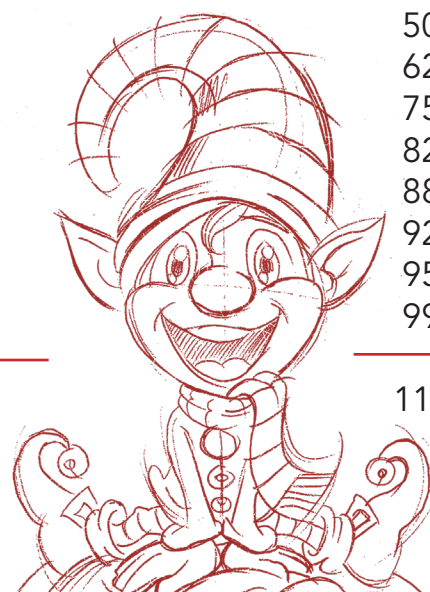



"At Christmas we should all be nicer". Many of us have said it, surely, we have all heard this phrase. But exactly what does it mean? Of course it has a lot to do with Santa's list where the nice is prized and the naughty is not. This should motivate us in fact to be nicer than usual.

Let's start by premising that, technically, to be 'nicer' we already must be nice, which makes the matter slightly more complicated!

Let us go in order then. We could categorise the living condition of every human being into four possibilities: 'naughty', 'not nice', 'nice', 'nicer'.

At this point for most people the question arises: "Which of the four states do I belong to?"

Let us state that normally an individual is not within a category statically but moves in and out of it frequently. Exactly, more or less aware, we jump in and out of each of these four states (naughty, not nice, nice and nicer) depending on how we behave! Our life is constantly changing because of how we decide to experience it, the way we behave and the decisions we make. This is not a blind lottery, what we would like to express and advise through these lines is that we have to be aware of the state we are in at the moment and ask ourselves if that is where we should be... if that is what we really want to be!

So let us outline the characteristics of the four behavioural states:

THE "NAUGHTY" ONE

We know very well who we find in this category. They are people who live in a state of being insensitive or unkind to anyone. They are not interested in the sufferings of others; on the contrary, they sometimes rejoice in them.

THE "NOT NICE" ONE

Beware, the 'not nice' is not to be confused with the naughty! Badness has within it a will, an active intention to do bad... the 'not nice', on the other hand, is merely an individual living in a state of chaos that leads to make decisions and behave without direction. However, a 'not nice' is in the precious condition of being close to nice and can become so when they realise that something is wrong. The "not nice" transition to being nice happens to these people as soon as they start desiring to work within themselves, to be conscious of what they are and what they do.

THE "NICE" ONE

The 'nice' one is oriented towards a virtuous life, take care of themselves consciously and in doing so spreads good living practices and makes people inclined to imitate them in their way of life.

The 'nice' one is fair and balanced, lives a 'Christmas all year round' by spreading serenity.

Who is Santa Claus?



Santa Claus is, with no doubt, the protagonist of the most precious memories that each of us collects while living. Some people associate this big-bellied figure with a specific period of their existence, usually childhood. Then we grow up and we all realise, to a greater or lesser degree, that Santa Claus took us by the hand as children, but only a few feel that he accompanied us even as adults. And, if we wish, he will be there, always with us.

Someone like Santa Claus does not give up on you because of a banal fact like the one that at a certain point you stop being a child and become an adult. On the contrary, he persistently inhabits our hearts to show us the essence of Christmas as often as we are willing to allow him to do so, at all ages.

SANTA CLAUS FOR THE CHILD

This is the most powerful time, there is no doubt about it, here we are in the very depths of magic. This is the age of meeting Santa Claus. Unforgettable!

Eyes, head, heart, and soul coincide, purity is a heavenly and necessary dimension, and this is why one is ready to welcome Santa Claus.

This is the stage of life when one experiences a special condition, because there are no differences in a child (at least those that adults see) and like the most willing of apprentices, he or she stands there, receiving what the world offers. Whether good or bad, the child that believes in Santa Claus has faith in the good and in all the actions they do.

Because after all, Christmas is a great chance of redemption for those who, unluckier than others, decide to 'Be Good' anyway. Of course, a child will make a promise to mum and dad, will be good, and does so because he or she wants to receive a little toy as a reward. However, it turns out that as we grow up, 'being good' will have different meaning and will reward in different ways, much more concrete though sometimes not tangible. The child is the 'receiver' of the transmission from those who have experienced Christmas before him or her, and this already tells us a lot about the responsibility that child takes on as he or she grows up.

A child's Christmas is based on the warmth of family, the flavours and scents of local traditions, the magic of an expectation, the colour of dreams and the cosiness of being together, because, regardless of all religious beliefs, each time a community comes together to renew a tradition, a sacred moment is created. Symbols, if you wish, but that have to do with the very reasons why human beings are in the world. Thus, Santa Claus is for the child something profoundly experienced in a simple way: the love that comes with a beard and belly and that writes and scrupulously checks (twice!) the great list of the good, in which to have one's name marked represents the possibility of getting the much-desired gift.

SANTA CLAUS FOR THE TEENAGER

We grow up, what we are starts to give way to 'what we are becoming' and this is a major crossroads in everyone's life. From here on, there will be lives that will be lost in the conviction of what one has become, and lives that, while progressing, will work to keep in touch with one's essence (what many call the inner child, is nothing but one's own purity). And it is here that the teenager starts his or her journey of growth, his or her attitudes, his or her 'presumption' to investigate the stories he or she believed until the day before, in favour of a natural desire to assert a newly learned 'rationality'.

Santa Claus is among the first victims of this stage of life. The 'age of certainties' one could call it, certainties that, as we know or will know, will crumble in time.

The faith in the existence of a man with a beard and a belly who brings gifts to the good ones vanishes. The typical (and indeed irrational) approach is one of rebellion even though,

without knowing it, we are placing ourselves before a wonderful test at this very moment: Santa Claus becomes a symbol and being good at this stage of life means learning to go beyond the trappings of logic, learning to BELIEVE in what is right and hold on despite much of what we see and experience suggests the opposite. Those who have the courage, despite all that may be against them, to pursue 'the good', to reward the kind soul, are surely choosing the most difficult path. Yes, it is true, the most difficult path, but because of this, they will receive a gift from Santa Claus.

And here you go back to experiencing Christmas, understanding its importance. One begins to feel that Christmas is a state of mind that one experiences not only for themselves but also for those people surrounding us. We become a nice gift to give to the people around us to make them happy, a very important gift especially for those who do not believe in this magic.

We understand the importance of becoming a medium between the wisdom of Santa Claus and the purity of the child waiting for him on the night of 24 December. We actually become a 100% Elf! At the end of this phase, one basically understands that all of us, people who believe in the good, are the Gift that Santa Claus gives to others to keep the light of Christmas lit in all its meaning.

For, his anger led him to 'steal everyone's Christmas', but once he did, his guilt and sadness triggered by it led him not only to restore the situation, but also to change his thinking!

GRINCH OUT OF VANITY

And here we are dealing with the Grinch out of vanity... perhaps the most complicated one. Let's say Mr. "I am different" "I have it all figured out", he is the one who does not sink to the level of the common mortals enslaved and deluded by the Christmas lights... he is a being who considers himself superior who thinks that this period is just one great binge of superficiality. Actually, those who fall into this category do not only have this attitude reserved for Christmas, because they feel the need to always find the argument that distinguishes them and puts them on a higher or at least different level from those showing sincere emotion. They are not people driven by malice; they just need to be given time

to discover the wonder of things. Sometimes, it is enough just to talk to him of the opposite of what he expects to hear. A Grinch out of vanity needs to be told, without overly activating his perception of wanting to convince him, that this superhero cape takes away much more than life would be ready to give him.

Therefore, the Grinch for Vanity does not convert, except through his own personal inner journey that (without him having to admit it to others) leads him to realise that this attitude is not only useless, but also harmful to him.

GRINCH AND THE CHRISTMAS SPIRIT

What does all this really teach us?

Returning to the protagonist of the Grinch's story, beyond all the nuances we have given him, we must also talk about the fact that if we want to, we can also have the same happy ending! Exactly, the Grinch realises that there is more to Christmas than what he thought he had stolen... one can steal material things, but not the meaning and spirit that Christmas lights up inside people's hearts. And much like what happens to Ebenezer Scrooge in Dickens' Christmas Carol, the Grinch finds his redemption by redeeming all the ugliness in favour of a new life.

Quoting the Grinch's inspirational author, Dr. Seuss, we agree that there are several good lessons to be learned in the story: "Children still have a strong sense of ethics," he said. "They want to see virtue rewarded and arrogance or meanness punished ... If the Grinch steals Christmas ... he has to bring it back in the end."

Besides, Dr. Geisel Seuss himself declared that he wrote the

story of the Grinch "to see if I could rediscover something about Christmas that obviously I'd lost," only to find it in probably one of the most famous ... and most meaningful stanzas of the play:

"Then the Grinch thought of something he hadn't before!
What if Christmas, he thought, doesn't come from a store.
What if Christmas...perhaps...means a little bit more!"

There is no decoration, shop or other display of Christmas that can replace the meaning we give it and that can only be found in one place: in ourselves

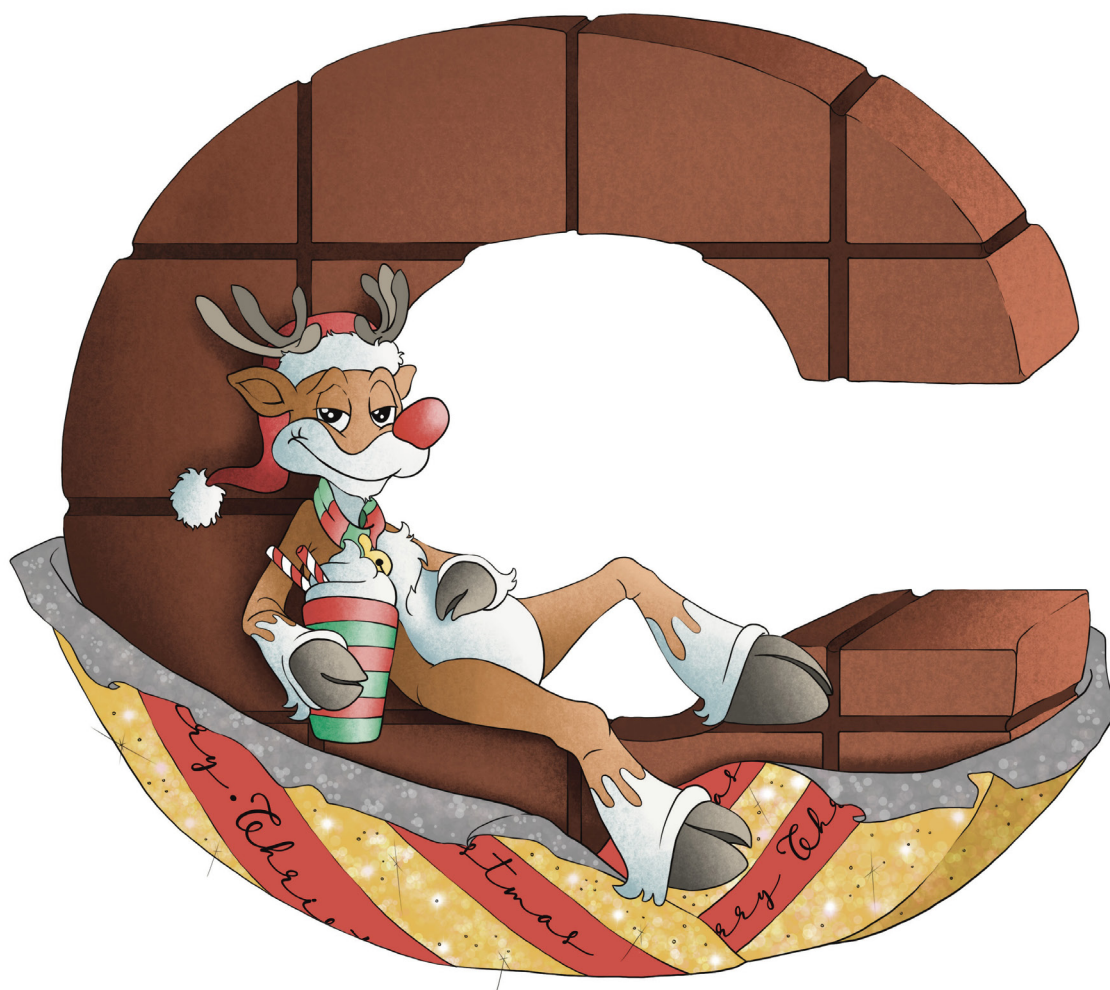
Origins

Time runs wild, it has no idea what Christmas is, what a birthday is, what a holiday is, what your life is, it has no idea that it is time.... Only you know this, Christmas depends on you, in your soul, and in the hearts of the people around you. Turn on that light inside you, and it will be Christmas, with all its colours.

What is Christmas?



Ever wondered what Christmas is? Well, come on, let's give it a try now -- see? The answer does not come so easily. This is because Christmas takes on meanings that change from when we are young to when we gradually grow up. This means we are naturally inclined to confuse it with the nostalgia of memories with the risk of reducing its true meaning to an ordinary habit.

But we will leave the real meaning of Christmas, the one with which to truly mirror and confront ourselves, for last... we will

So, Scrooge turns back, redeems himself and decides to direct his life towards generosity and love of others.

Years go by, exactly 49, and across the world, what would later become the second Light of Christmas was born almost by chance in 1892! We are talking about Coca Cola putting its bottle in the hands of a Father Christmas redesigned and repainted for the occasion.

This is the beginning of the POP Christmas... an era in which the symbols of this festivity would be used (especially over the last 40 years) to drive commerce and consumerism at the speed of light! However, it should be noted that at that time society was taking its first steps into the magical world of marketing, and could count on a level of culture, education and values very different from those of today... in short, there was still a certain substance behind all those Mottos and banners, and with substance we simply mean the awareness of the existence of values such as a love towards others, towards oneself, kindness, loyalty, authenticity. All in all, what do we mean with this Christmas? We have digressed at length into what Christmas has represented and can represent for the society that experiences it, but we have not yet even begun to scratch the surface of what it really means. So, there it is, the meaning of Christmas, sitting back and grinning at us as we live, welcoming with open arms and hearts anyone who can lift their head and notice the obvious signals it sends.

Christmas is THE BEGINNING... stop! But have we realised the magnitude of what we have just said and the immense opportunity it holds for us? Charles Dickens understood this well... Christmas teaches us (especially us adults) that the beginning is not in the past, but cyclical! Christmas is the chance to go back and start again from that very beginning. 3. Illusion:

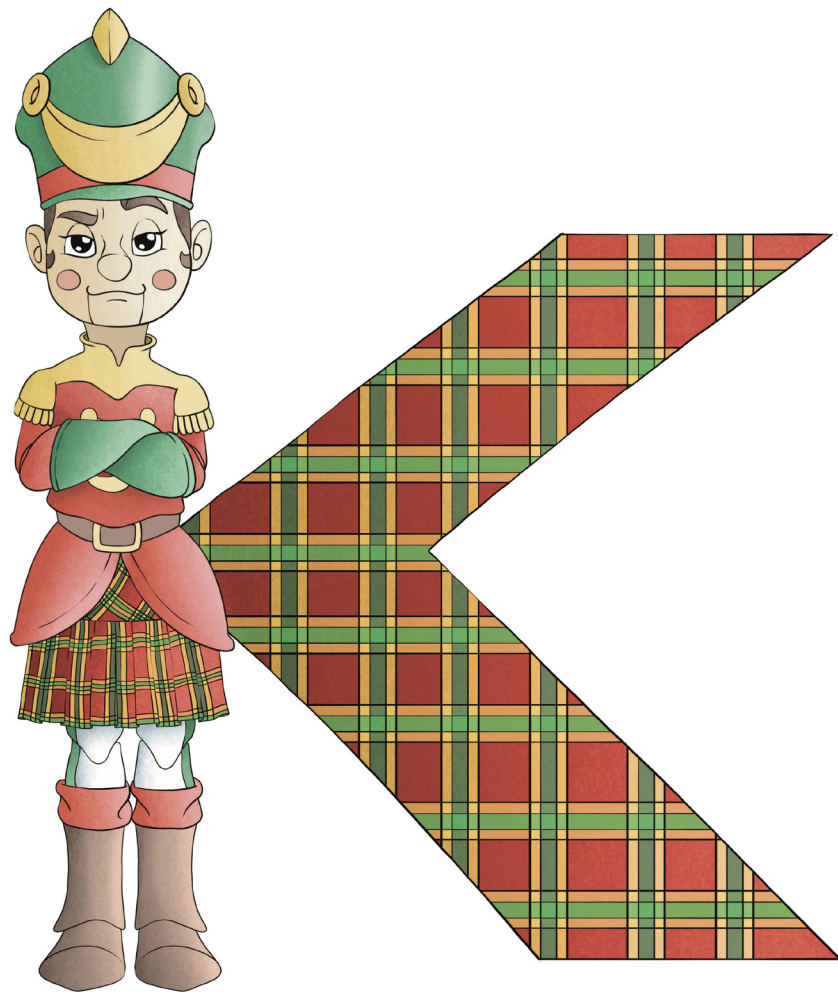
So, the next time you look up at the night sky, search for Lucy, the Christmas Wish Star, and allow your heart to express an

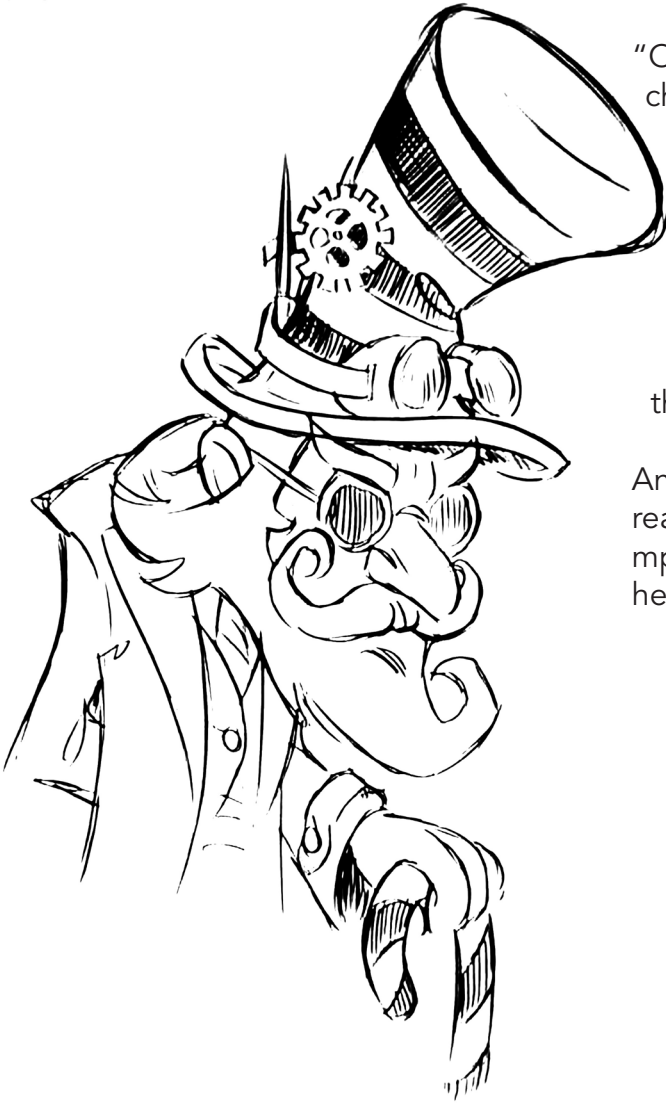
"Huh, well, my dear Santa... what about the little ones who then no

INVOLVING ADULTS

The golden rule is to involve adults as Santa Claus’s “helpers.” Explain to children that adults are part of the magic and assist Santa Claus in his task of bringing joy and gifts. It is crucial to say that they can do this because many years ago, they too were good children, and over time, the Spirit of Christmas “hired” them to help in this great magical work.

The Befana Comes at Night...



For those unfamiliar with the Befana, she is a character from Italian folklore akin to Santa Claus in some respects. On the night of January 5th, she flies on her broomstick delivering sweets and small gifts to good children and coal to the naughty ones. The Befana's tradition is linked to Epiphany, a Christian feast day that celebrates the revelation of God incarnate as Jesus Christ. In Italian culture, the Befana embodies the themes of transformation, humility, and inner beauty, serving as a reminder of the deeper meanings behind holiday traditions. Similar figures can be found in other cultures, such as La Vieja Belén in Spain and Babushka in Russia.

Epiphany is a celebration rich in meaning, often reduced to a tradition of sweets and coal. However, the true significance

of Epiphany is much deeper and rooted in our history and culture. The word “Epiphany” comes from the Greek and means “manifestation” or “appearance.” In a spiritual and symbolic context, this manifestation is the revelation of the purest part of ourselves, the sacred that resides within each of us.

Those who manage to find beauty beyond appearances continue to receive sweets from the Befana, a symbol of recognition and reward for the ability to see with the heart. Conversely, those who judge only by outward appearances, who fail to grasp the hidden treasure, end up with coal, a sign of the need for

further introspection and growth... In other words, they must face another round in Dr. Krampy's coal mines! After all, what better than coal represents the fact that within appearances there can be the potential for a diamond?

The story of "Beauty and the Beast" is a perfect example of this concept. The King, who does not recognize the beauty behind the humble requests of an old woman, is punished with coal. However, even coal can be seen as an opportunity. When understood and worked on, coal can transform into a diamond, a symbol of growth and transformation... just as happened to that famous King

The Befana is thus a symbol of transformation, of the ability to see hidden potential and to turn coal into diamonds. And to understand that, deep down, the path of our life is to work on ourselves so as not to remain coal. Everything, when you think about it, has a coal state and if well worked on, can become a diamond... think of when you take a difficulty (coal) and turn it into an opportunity (diamond)! The only certainty is that if we do nothing, everything remains coal.

Each Epiphany thus offers us the opportunity to reflect on this journey, to appreciate the lessons learned, and to prepare for

a new cycle of growth and discovery. The Befana reminds us that, regardless of appearances, there is always beauty and wisdom to discover if we are willing to look carefully and with an open heart..

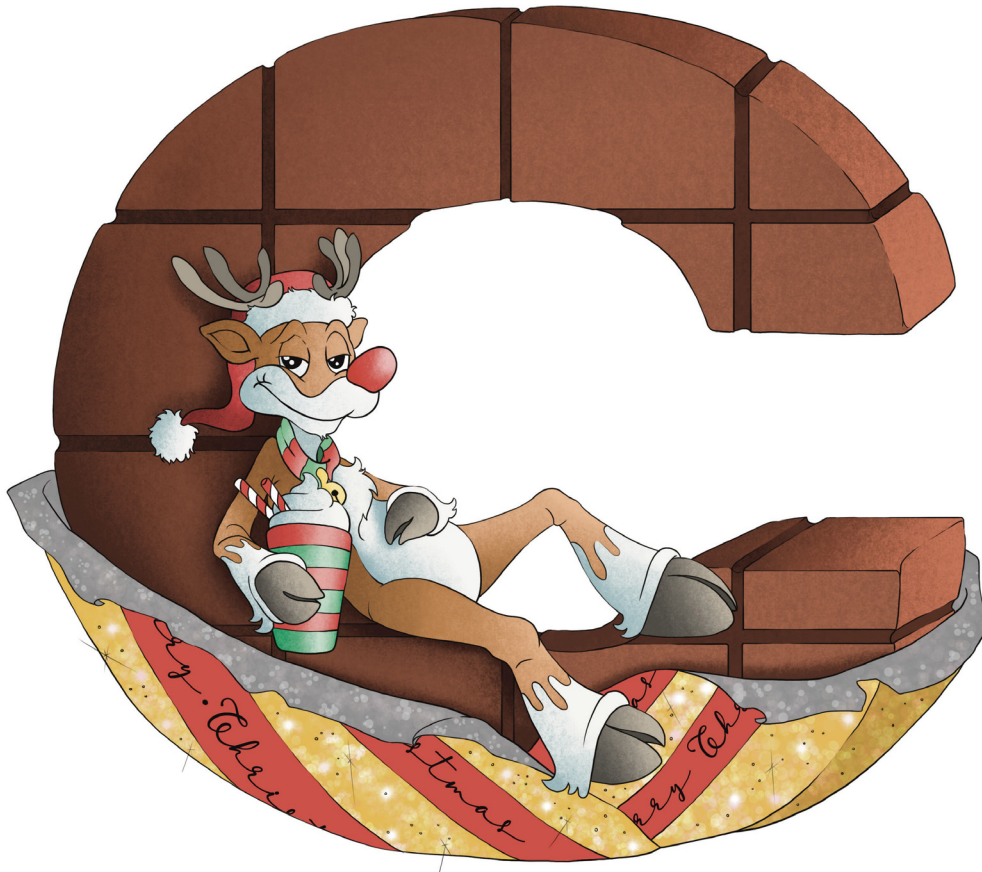
Origins

But let's go back to that first question: why doesn't Santa leave earlier? Why does he wait until the very last night? Maybe because every gift needs its own "cooking time." You can't rush it, and you can't hold on too long either. There's a perfect moment when everything aligns, and the gift arrives. The principle is simple: what happens today is the result of what we planted yesterday. Results don't take years to show up. If we pay attention, we can already see the first signs almost immediately. And when the outcome arrives, that's our gift.

If the gift is what we hoped for, it means we've been working well in the "world of causes" ... that invisible dimension where every decision is made before it becomes action. If it's not

what we expected, we start again. We adjust something, we send our wish back into the world, like a new letter that will spark a new journey and bring a new gift. Every action generates an effect, and what we receive is always a reflection of our choices.

This holds true for everything that comes into our life, even the hard things we often blame on external forces. It all begins with us, and it all comes back to us.

That's where time becomes central. The cycle of 24 hours is a reminder that every day, we have the chance to change, to do better, to reprogram our thoughts and actions. We don't need to wait years to see change... life is faster than we think. A single small gesture can send out a wave of wonder that expands and finds its way back to us when we least expect it. This is the real magic of Christmas: the awareness that WONDER leaves no part of our world untouched and is always ready to find us. All it takes is to act with the right heart, at the right time, and in a heartbeat, or better yet, in a reindeer's flight, what we wished for will be right there, in front of our eyes.

24 hours for a trip around the world.

24 hours for an inner revolution.

And what if the greatest gift is this awareness itself?

Becoming a Child Again: What Does It Mean?



Sometimes it feels like just a figure of speech, an abstract idea, a nice phrase meant to stir up nostalgia. Becoming a child again: a saying we often use without really thinking about it, as if it were one of those things we say but deep down know is impossible.

But is it truly impossible? Can we really become children again? The answer is yes. And it's far from abstract.

Becoming a child again doesn't mean regressing or erasing the path we've walked. It doesn't mean playing with toys or avoiding the re-

sponsibilities of adult life. It means rediscovering who we really are... beneath all the layers we've built to fit into the world. As we grow, we shape ourselves to meet expectations. We learn to blend in, to be accepted, to be seen as "responsible adults." And in the process, we often sacrifice something precious: our purest essence.

Every child is born authentic, spontaneous, curious, excited by life. But then something happens. Usually, it's a moment of pain: a disappointment, a criticism, a judgment that hurt us. That's when the adaptation process begins.

We learn to hide the most genuine parts of ourselves, because we fear they're not good enough. We're told that to survive in the "grown-up world," we need to let those parts go. And so, piece by piece, we lose touch with our most authentic self.

But here's the truth: that part of us never disappears. It stays there, somewhere, suspended in time, waiting for us to come back for it. Becoming a child again means exactly that: going back to the moment where we left that child behind, abandoned in the race toward adulthood. It's a journey backward, often a difficult one, because it means having the courage to face the wounds that made us leave that child behind in the first place.

It's at the heart of many therapeutic journeys, the foundation of modern psychology: going back to the moments where we lost trust, working through them, and bringing home the forgotten child we once were.

Becoming a child again is as hard as growing up, but with one essential difference: growing up often happens to us; becoming a child again is a conscious choice. It's an act of courage, a journey of reconciliation with ourselves.

It means no longer being ashamed of our sensitivity, our creativity, our spontaneity.

It means allowing ourselves to laugh without fear of being judged, to feel excitement without worrying about looking silly, to be moved without fearing we'll seem fragile.

And what happens when we reclaim that part of us? The effects are extraordinary.

Life changes...it lights up.

Suddenly, we see how beauty is everywhere, how inspiration is born from simplicity, how our relationships become more authentic when we stop playing a role.

Becoming a child again makes us freer, happier, more able to live in the present. It doesn't mean we stop being adults... it means we finally become whole adults, integrating every part of ourselves, without denying who we once were.

We don't have to wait. The child we were is always there, inside us, waiting for us to take their hand and bring them home. And when we do, we realize it wasn't just nostalgia... it was the key to living our life fully.
